Students may receive a detention for incidents that are more serious than level 1 behaviours. Students may be placed on a monitoring card for up to five lessons in the subject causing concern.	Continued level 2 behaviour will result in further referrals and three days of lunchtime detention. A parent meeting may be held. This will occur after the third level 2 behaviour within a school term. Students may be placed on a monitoring card for five days across all lessons. Students may also receive a suspension for incidents that are more serious long detention behaviours.	Seriously disruptive, dangerous or disrespectful behaviour may result in a suspension from school. A parent meeting will be held. A short suspension may be actioned following a student's third long detention offence within a school term. Short suspensions can also be actioned at the Senior Executive or Principal's discretion. Short suspensions may be either in school or out of school.	Seriously disruptive, dangerous or disrespectful behaviour may result in a suspension from school. A parent meeting will be held. A long suspension may be actioned following a student's repeated short suspension offence within a school term. Long suspensions may also be actioned at the Senior Executive or Principal's discretion.	Very serious incidents or repeated suspension behaviours may result in the student's enrolment at the school being terminated. This may be actioned at the Principal's discretion.
	Students may not be eligible to represent the school externally for a period of time (excursions/sport/camps/etc). Consequences may be adjusted, depending on the circumstances of the incident, and at executive staff discretion.
