<p>These are low-level incidents of disruptive behaviour that will be managed by the class teacher using their own management strategies.</p> <p>Teachers can send students out of the classroom as a consequence at their discretion.</p>	<p>The student will take part in a session reviewing their behaviour at lunch time to ensure they can be a positive member of the school community.</p> <p>Continued level 1 behaviours.</p> <p>Students may receive a detention for incidents that are more serious than level 1 behaviours.</p> <p>Students may be placed on a monitoring card for up to five lessons in the subject causing concern.</p>	<p>Continued level 2 behaviour will result in further referrals and three days of lunchtime detention. A parent meeting may be held.</p> <p>This will occur after the third level 2 behaviour within a school term.</p> <p>Students may be placed on a monitoring card for five days across all lessons.</p> <p>Students may also receive a suspension for incidents that are more serious long detention behaviours.</p>	<p>Seriously disruptive, dangerous or disrespectful behaviour may result in a suspension from school. A parent meeting will be held.</p> <p>A short suspension may be actioned following a student's third long detention offence within a school term.</p> <p>Short suspensions can also be actioned at the Senior Executive or Principal's discretion. Short suspensions may be either in school or out of school.</p>	<p>Seriously disruptive, dangerous or disrespectful behaviour may result in a suspension from school. A parent meeting will be held.</p> <p>A long suspension may be actioned following a student's repeated short suspension offence within a school term.</p> <p>Long suspensions may also be actioned at the Senior Executive or Principal's discretion.</p>	<p>Very serious incidents or repeated suspension behaviours may result in the student's enrolment at the school being terminated.</p> <p>This may be actioned at the Principal's discretion.</p>
<p><i>Students may not be eligible to represent the school externally for a period of time (excursions/sport/camps/etc). Consequences may be adjusted, depending on the circumstances of the incident, and at executive staff discretion.</i></p>
